The Womens Enclave Project was inaugurated at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry by Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President Gujrat Chamber, Dr. Tayyab Hafeez Cheema, RPO Gujrat and Gujranwala, Dr. Mustansar Atta Bajwa, DPO Gujrat, Haji Nasir Mahmood, Group Leader, Mr. Ishfaq Ahmed Razi, Group Leader, Mr. Moosa Nadeem, Senior Vice President, along with Executive Members, Former Presidents, and other senior members.





This project has been completed with the support of the business community of Gujrat, in which Chenab Orchard (a project of Malhi Group), Sethi's Lifestyle, office bearers, and executive members of Gujrat Chamber have contributed. After the inauguration, a meeting session was also arranged in GtCCI. Women's Enclave is a great service for the women members of Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the women of Gujrat city, where they will be provided with more than ten services including a reporting center for police matters, a reporting center for Police and Cybercrime, women's ombudsman, social welfare, Khidmat Markaz, Driving Training school, and liaison for free legal aid and counseling services. The latest simulator for women's driving classes has also been installed in this enclave.







In addition, the members of Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry can also services of One Window Facilitation Center established in Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry is your institution, and all these services are for you. Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry will continue to provide services to its members in the same way. 6 bikes were also been specially gifted by Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry to lady police officers for patrolling.

Dr. Tayyab Hafeez Cheema, RPO Gujranwala, said that there is great joy in coming to Gujrat Chamber today and there is also a sense of success. The foundation of a state-of-the-art Women's Enclave has been laid in Gujrat Chamber today. 6 bikes have also been gifted by Gujrat Chamber, which will be used in areas where women shop. 12 lady constables will patrol and for this they will be trained from Gujranwala.

In this Women's Enclave, women will be provided with driving training on a modern simulator and licenses will be issued here. Apart from this, counseling, FIR, crime report, registration report, violence, dowry matters, legal guidance and many other services will be provided under one roof and for this, you will not have to go to the police station, but everything will be available at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry. He appreciated the GtCCI and said Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry is currently leading among all chambers and deserves praise for building a Women's Enclave in less than two months.







AMBASSADOR OF PORTUGAL H.E MR. FREDERICO SILVA



The Ambassador of Portugal to Pakistan, H.E. Mr. Frederico Silva, accompanied by Mr. Iftikhar Feroze (Honorary Counsellor Lahore and Ms Rifat Fatima Human Rights Officer, visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce & Industry GtCCI and met with the business community under the presidency of Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President GtCCI.





President Mr. Muham mad Munir Peshawari welcomed the Ambassador, introduced Gujrat's rich industrial base, and emphasized strengthening Pakistan-Portugal trade ties, noting that Pakistan's exports to Portugal are around \$430 million and imports about \$35 million. He also noted that cultural and educational exchanges between Pakistan and Portugal have contributed to stronger mutual understanding and cooperation, including collaborations in education and cultural activities. He highlighted the need for trade delegations, B2B meetings, and agreements to boost bilateral trade and sought support to provide access for Gujrat's products to Portuguese and European markets.











Ambassador H.E.Mr. Frederico Silva appreciated the hospitality, praised Gujrat's vibrant business community, and highlighted that a large Pakistani diaspora especially from Gujrat resides in Portugal. He mentioned Portugal's \$300 billion economy, 11 million population, and 80% renewable energy production, with key sectors including IT and renewable energy. He noted Pakistan mainly exports rice, textiles, surgical instruments, and leather to Portugal, while Portugal exports machinery, paper, cork, and scrap, and mentioned that Portuguese cork is used in cricket balls made in Pakistan. He encouraged joint ventures and noted that Portugal and Pakistan have signed an MoU on education and research and share 75 years of diplomatic relations. He invited Pakistani exporters to approach the Embassy of Pakistan in Portugaland relevant trade bodies for guidance on entering the Portuguese market.

An introductory video on Portugal's industry and technology was shown, and the meeting concluded with the presentation of a souvenir to the Ambassador by the President GtCCI.





















AMBASSADOR OF KAZAKHSTAN TO PAKISTAN

E MR. YERZHAN KASTAFI



His Excellency Mr. Yerzhan Kastafin, Ambassador of Kazakhstan to Pakistan, accompanied by members of the International Chamber of Commerce of Kazakhstan and the First Secretary Kazakhstan Embassy Pakistan, visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry and held a meeting with Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Guirat Chamber, along with Executive Members. Former Presidents, and Members of the Chamber.

The President GtCCI welcomed the Ambassador of Kazakhstan and said that this is his second visit to the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce, which is an important step toward strengthening trade relations between the two countries. He said that the Chamber is striving to promote domestic trade and is seeking strong international ties to support this. The Chamber is in close contact with various embassies and trade missions in Pakistan, and a high-profile delegation from the Gujrat Chamber has also visited Kazakhstan with the full support of the Ambassador.

















He briefed the Ambassador on the industries of Gujrat, which include electrical appliances (especially fans), furniture, pottery and ceramics, shoes, carpets, textiles and garments, PVC pipes, precast products, gems and jewelry, soaps and detergents, and agricultural products. He said, there are over 450 units in the fan sector, more than 150 units in pottery and ceramics, around 900 furniture units, and over 250 units in various other businesses. He added that strong ties have been built between Gujrat Chamber and the Embassy of Kazakhstan, and under the patronage of the Ambassador, their delegation members reviewed trade opportunities in Kazakhstan, which helped boost bilateral trade. He expressed the desire to further strengthen this relationship and exchange more delegations in the future to promote bilateral trade and networking. He said the purpose of this meeting was to further enhance trade and diplomatic relations between Kazakhstan and Pakistan and open new doors for development.



Ambassador Mr. Yerzhan Kastafin said that they are trying to promote bilateral trade and have established the International Chamber of Commerce of Kazakhstan for this purpose. He said they want to resolve trade-related issues. He mentioned that the Prime Minister of Kazakhstan recently met the, Prime Minister of Pakistan, during the OIC conference to discuss current challenges and their solutions. He added that direct flights will be launched to solve connectivity issues between the two countries, and agreements have been signed with and for logistics support. He highlighted that Kazakhstan's construction sector is growing rapidly, and there is high demand for furniture and pottery. They plan to bring business delegations from Kazakhstan to Pakistan and organize a conference. He shared that trade between Pakistan and Kazakhstan has doubled over the past year, reaching \$200 million, and efforts are underway to raise it to \$1 billion. He also gave a presentation on business opportunities in Kazakhstan, stating that the country ranks 61st in Asia for foreign direct investment, has a per capita income of around \$14,000, and a GDP of \$264 billion. He added that Kazakhstan has very favorable tax policies for businesses.

He mentioned that there are vast opportunities in the minerals and agriculture sectors. For banking, Kazakhstan has the on the model of the , which offers tax exemptions until 2066. They are also implementing e-visas to make business visa issuance easier after verification. Businesses can be registered within a week, and support will be provided if needed. He said that it takes a maximum of one week to register a business in Kazakhstan. You can start a business individually or with a partner.

At the end of the session, Vice President of GtCCI, thanked the guests and expressed hope that new avenues of trade would open between the two countries and new opportunities would emerge. He assured that delegations from the Gujrat Chamber would definitely be organized to Kazakhstan in the future.

The Ambassador was then taken on a tour of the industrial sectors of Gujrat. He visited Alfalah Trade Center, Taimur Fans, Alhamid Ceramics, Trendline Furnishers, and NM Furnishers, where he witnessed the quality of products and production processes.





HIGH COMMISSIONER OF BANGLADESH TO PAKISTAN H.E. MR. IQBAL HUSSAIN KHAN



High Commissioner of Bangladesh to Pakistan H.E. Mr. Igbal Hussain Khan along with Mr. Aminul Islam Khan, Deputy High Commissioner, Mr. Tayeb Ali, Counselor, and other officials visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry and held a meeting with the business community of Gujrat.

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President GtCCI, welcomed the distinguished guests and introduced them to the industry and trade of Gujrat. He highlighted the services and role of GtCCI and said that Pakistan and Bangladesh have strong diplomatic and trade relations, which have further strengthened in recent years. Both countries are exploring new opportunities for cooperation in various sectors. Pakistan exports textiles, cement, fans and pharmaceutical products to Bangladesh, while Bangladesh supplies jute, ready-made garments and raw materials to Pakistan. In 2023, Pakistan exported goods worth 690 million dollars to Bangladesh. Both countries are considering direct business exchanges and preferential trade agreements to further expand trade relations.







Mr. Peshawari thanked Bangladesh for its support during the India-Pakistan conflict and said that Bangladesh is a brotherly country with which bilateral relations should be further strengthened. He said that Gujrat is already exporting pedestal and ceiling fans to Bangladesh. Gujrat's solid wood furniture industry is known worldwide for its quality and craftsmanship and can perform well in the Bangladeshi market. He also mentioned that the pottery, ceramics and tableware industry of Gujrat is an emerging sector producing beautiful and high-quality products. He added that footwear, textiles, garments, carpets and PVC products from Gujrat are known for their quality and could also be introduced in Bangladesh. He requested the High Commission to support in promoting exports of electrical appliances, furniture, and tableware from this region. He added GtCCI also plans to send a trade delegation to Bangladesh to strengthen bilateral trade relations and explore new business opportunities.



H.E. Mr. Igbal Hussain Khan thanked GtCCI for the warm welcome and said that he had visited the chambers of the Golden Triangle — Sialkot Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Guiranwala Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and now GtCCI in Gujrat.

He appreciated the quality and competitive pricing of Pakistani products and said that the Government of Bangladesh wants to improve its relations with Pakistan which have remained limited for the past fifteen years.

He said both countries have seaports which can be used to improve trade. Direct flights between Pakistan and Bangladesh are also being planned, and two private airlines from each country will operate these flights to save time and cost. Bangladesh wants to export pineapples and coconuts to Pakistan and import sugar and rice from Pakistan. He emphasized that Pakistan and Bangladesh can be the best markets for each other, and now is the time to strengthen mutual trade relations.







He stressed on greater cooperation among South Asian countries and the importance of South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) to enhance regional trade. He said South Asian countries are rich in history, culture and skills and should cooperate with each other in times of crisis to ensure smooth trade. Bangladesh has simplified its visa process and will launch an online visa system by December to make it easier. He also said that both countries are working on reducing customs duties to promote trade between Pakistan and Bangladesh.











COMMERCIAL COUNSELOR OF THE EMBASSY OF UZBEKISTAN IN PAKISTAN

A meeting was held at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry with Mr. Ravshan Jamanov, Commercial Counselorofthe Embassy of Uzbekistan in Pakistan,

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari welcomed the guest and highlighted that the Gujrat Chamber is actively working to promote domestic trade while building strong international linkages. He introduced the industrial landscape of Gujrat, mentioning its diverse production sectors, including electrical appliances, furniture, pottery, ceramics, shoes, carpets, textiles, garments, PVC pipes, precast materials, gems and jewelry, soaps and detergents, auto body parts, and agricultural products such as wheat, sugarcane, and rice. He noted that trade between Pakistan and Uzbekistan has seen remarkable growth from around USD 300 million in 2023 to USD 404 million by mid-2025 driven by improved logistics, joint projects, and expansion of the preferential trade agreement. Both countries have set targets to raise bilateral trade to USD 1 billion in the near future and eventually to USD 2 billion, supported by efforts to enhance transit logistics, industrial cooperation, and trade facilitation. He expressed the Chamber's intent to exchange trade delegations with Uzbekistan to further strengthen bilateral economic and diplomatic ties.









Mr. Ravshan Jamanov, Commercial Counselor thanked the Chamber for the warm welcome, stating that his visit aimed to learn about Gujrat's industry and explore opportunities to boost trade with Pakistan, especially in electrical appliances and agricultural products such as rice and mangoes. He mentioned that three direct flights are currently operating between the two countries two from Lahore and one from Islamabad with plans to start flights from Karachi as well. He highlighted that Uzbekistan has three tax-free economic zones with waived utility charges and received over USD 37 billion in foreign direct investment last year. Mr. Jamanov invited a business delegation from Gujrat to visit Uzbekistan and assured full facilitation in logistics, payments, and investment opportunities, stressing that the infrastructure is ready and there are no barriers to doing business.

MEETING WITH PRIME MINISTER OF PAKISTAN MIAN M. SHAHBAZ SHARIF

Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry, attended a high-level meeting chaired by **Mian Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif**, Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan.





During the meeting, President CtCCI highlighted key issues related to the industrial sector of Gujrat. He emphasized the vital role that Gujrat's industry plays in the economic development of the country. He also raised serious concerns about the frequent and unannounced electricity shutdowns in Gujrat, particularly in industrial and commercial areas, which are badly affecting business operations. Furthermore, he discussed the challenges related to the industrial estate, infrastructure, and other critical issues being faced by the local business community.







GtCCI MEETING WITH MINISTER FINANCE

An important interactive session was held under the Presidency of Mr. Atifl kram Sheikh, President of the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI), to discuss in detail the issues related to Sections 37A and 37B of the Finance Act and Section 21(s) of the Income Tax Ordinance, along with broader economic policies and the implementation of digital invoicing. The special guest of the session was Mr. Bilal Azhar Kayani, Minister of State for Finance, while senior officers of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) including Member Customs Policy, Member IR Policy, and Member Operations also participated.

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry, along with Haji Nasir Mehmood Group Leader, and Executive Memebrs, attended the session through an online video link.

Representing the business community of Gujrat, the President of GtCCI presented his reservations and suggestions on the proposed provisions of the Finance Bill and the practical challenges arising from Section 21(s) of the Income Tax Ordinance. He demanded that the government abolish Sections 37A and 37B, amend Section 21(s), and set its minimum threshold at Rs.1 million. Heemphasized that there is serious concern in the business community regarding these laws,







All participants urged the government to take the concerns of the business community seriously and reconsider the controversial provisions of the Finance Bill.





PCSIR

PAKISTAN COUNCIL OF SCIENTIFIC & INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH



The inauguration ceremony of the Pakistan Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (PCSIR) Collection Center was held at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry. The event was attended by Dr. Naheed Kausar Member Science, PCSIR Head Office Islamabad, Dr. Muhammad Tehseen Aslam Director Marketing, and Engr. Abdul Wahab Director Daska.





Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Gujrat Chamber, welcomed the guests and introduced the Chamber's services, including the One Window Facilitation Center and Women Enclave. He said that establishing the PCSIR Collection Center at the Chamber is a major achievement for Gujrat's industrial sectors, especially fans, ceramics, pottery, PVC, precast, soaps and detergents, and rice. Previously, businesses had to send samples to other cities for testing, but now collection and reporting will be done directly in Gujrat. The center will also collect ISO and Pakistan Standards and Quality Control Authority (PSQCA) samples from factories. He noted that PCSIR also provides industrial research, technical services, training, and technology transfer, and expressed gratitude to Dr. Naheed Kausar and Dr. Tehseen Aslam for approving the PCSIR Help Desk, as well as to Engr. Abdul Wahab for his efforts in completing the approval process.













Engr. Abdul Wahab said that Gujrat's industries previously faced difficulties due to the lack of local testing facilities, which this center will now resolve by providing sample collection and reports locally, along with complete process guidance.

Dr. Naheed Kausar stated that the center will handle all kinds of testing — quality tests for import/export, ceramics, textiles, leather, and certifications for sensitive items.

Dr. Tehseen Aslam said the center will save industries significant time and cost, with testing rates up to 40% lower than private labs. Over 4,000 types of tests are offered, including for textiles, minerals, water, food items, rice, wheat, PVC, fans, furniture, packaging, machinery, soil, and more. A full list of tests and rates is available on the PCSIR website.

At the end, a Memorandum of Understanding was also signed between PCSIR and the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry to formally launchthis collaboration.

Ms. Syeda Noreen Zahira, Chief Commissioner Inland Revenue Sialkot, along with Ms. Fauzia Adil, Commissioner Inland Revenue Gujrat, and other tax officials, held a meeting with the business community of Gujrat at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry on the invitation of Gujrat Chamber







Mr. Fahad Rafiq, Vice President Gujrat Chamber, raised concerns about system bottlenecks caused by late sales tax returns and suggested stronger checks to prevent fake

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President Gujrat Chamber, said that the business community is the backbone of the country's economy. Pakistan is facing many challenges in its tax system. The targets of various taxes imposed by FBR, including income tax, sales tax, customs, federal excise, and withholding tax, should be realistic and determined by keeping in view the current economic situation. He added that Pakistan's tax-to-GDP ratio is only 8.7% one of the lowest in the region and called for broadening the tax net instead of overburdening existing taxpayers. He also suggested reducing the corporate tax rate to 29%, restoring 1% export withholding tax as final tax, making advance tax adjustable, issuing sales tax refunds promptly, and withdrawing unnecessary withholding notices. He emphasized











Ms. Syeda Noreen Zahira assured full cooperation to the business community of Gujrat, adding that policy decisions are made by the government while FBR implements them. She said efforts are being made to speed up refunds, with over Rs. 4 billion issued last year, and requested help in identifying fake refund claimants. She encouraged businesses to submit

their issues in writing so they can be presented to the board.







MEETING WITH RM SNGPL



A meeting was held at the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry with Mr. Rizwan Mushtaq, Regional Manager SNGPL Guirat.

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Gujrat Chamber, welcomed Rizwan Mushtag to the Chamber and requested the establishment of an SNGPL Help Desk at the Chamber's One Window Facilitation Center so that members' SNGPL-related issues can be recorded and resolved under one roof. He highlighted various problems faced by the business community, especially the pottery sector, which is an important and traditional industrial sector of Gujrat and relies heavily on gas as a raw material. He stated that the industry is facing serious issues regarding gas pressure and gas tariffs. He questioned whether separate pipelines have been given to the industry, then why are they still facing low pressure? Regarding the Gas Infrastructure Development Cess (GIDC), he said that although the Supreme Court had ruled that it was abolished and all its installments with markup have already been paid, issues are still arising in this regard, and its policy should be clarified. He expressed hope that the problems of the business community would be resolved on a priority basis and thanked the SNGPL team for visiting the Chamber











Mr. Rizwan Mushtaq, Regional Manager SNGPL Gujrat, said that they are determined to solve the problems of the business community, although some issues like GIDC and tariff matters are not in their domain, but he will still try his best to get them resolved. He informed that to improve gas pressure for the industry, they have completed the new Gas Pipeline Project at Chah Tarang at a cost of 250 million rupees from SNGPL's own funds. Any issue of gas pressure will be resolved. He said that he will write to the MD of SNGPL to get approval for the SNGPL Help Desk at the Chamber, and until then, their representative will visit the Chamber once a week. He stated that RLNG rates will come down in the coming days. There is also a meeting scheduled with the fan industry next week. They will conduct a cost analysis of commercial consumers, and if needed, they will lay separate gas lines. He assured that his doors are open for the Chamber members, and they will be given full protocol. He expressed happiness over visiting the Chamber and appreciated that the facilities being provided to the Chamber members are not available anywhereelse.

TAJKISTAN DELEGATION VISITS GtCC



A high-profile business delegation from Tajikistan representing various sectors including electrical, construction, textile, agriculture, hydro turbines, juice and beverages, IT, mines and minerals, sanitary, and other industries held a meeting with the business community of Gujrat at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry.





Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Guirat Chamber. welcomed the delegation and introduced the industries and trade of Gujrat. He said that their visit is an important step in strengthening trade relations between the two countries. He added that the Gujrat Chamber is striving to promote domestic trade and is looking forward to building strong international ties. Gujrat Chamber of Commerce & Industry is already in close contact with various embassies and trade missions in Pakistan and has also recently taken a high-profile delegation to Tajikistan. He said that Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and the Embassy of Tajikistan have strong relations. Under the patronage of H.E. Mr. Sharifzoda Yusuf Toir, the Ambassador of Tajikistan, members of Gujrat delegation not only explored trade opportunities in Tajikistan but also started their own businesses there, which will significantly boost bilateral trade. He added that the purpose of today's meeting is to further strengthen trade and diplomatic relations between Tajikistan and Pakistan, which will open new doors of development in the future.





Mr. Samundar Khan, representing the Tajik delegation, said that they are eager to increase trade with Pakistan and that this visit is aimed at promoting business ties. He said that there are many business opportunities in Tajikistan, and by partnering with them, Pakistani businesses can also gain access to Russia.

Haji Fayyaz Alam, Secretary Shaheen Group, thanked the delegation and said that under the guidance of the Tajik Ambassador to Pakistan, they had earlier taken a successful delegation to Tajikistan to explore business opportunities. He expressed hope that trade between Gujrat and Tajikistan would continue to grow in the future. A large number of representatives from the local business community also attended the meeting.

MEETING WITH CEO GEPCO



Engineer Muhammad Ayub, Chief Executive of the Gujranwala Electric Power Company (GEPCO), along with Mr. Shafigur Rehman, SE GEPCO, and other GEPCO officials visited the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry (GtCCI).







Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of CtCCI, warmly welcomed the guests and introduced them to the industrial profile of Gujraticity and the services of GtCCI. He said that the purpose of the meeting was to present the problems faced by Gujrat's industrial and trade sector related to GEPCO and find comprehensive solutions. He highlighted that similar issues had also been discussed earlier during meetings at the GEPCO office. He pointed out several challenges, including frequent transformer breakdowns and electricity shortages during the summer season. He emphasized that there is a severe shortage of GEPCO staff in Guirat, especially linemen and line superintendents. He stressed that existing staff should be properly trained to provide timely services despite the shortage. He also mentioned that the service numbers printed on electricity bills are often not attended to, making it difficult to register complaints. He said that for the last three to four years, whenever a single transformer or line needs repair, the entire feeder is shut down, which disrupts many industries connected to that feeder. The business community needs to be properly educated on the import and export of green meter units, as there is a lot of confusion about the formula. He raised concerns about the penalty imposed on consumers in the form of detection, and sought clarity on charges for changing meters. He also requested the CEO to ensure the presence of representatives at the CEPCO Help Desk established in the GtCCI One Window Facilitation Center, as the two appointed representatives have been absent. He requested that at least one representative should be available three days a week.

Mr. Haji Nasir Mahmood, Group Leader of Shaheen Group, said that the biggest problem is the shortage of staff. He highlighted that staff recruited for Guirat are often transferred to other cities, creating a persistent shortage locally. He said that transformer breakdowns in the Small Industrial Estate result in feeder-wide shutdowns almost daily. He proposed giving SDOs the authority to replace transformers directly instead of requiring approvals from SE and XEN, to save time. He also pointed out that many wires are hanging dangerously and should be replaced with four-core wires urgently.









Mr. Malik Mazhar Igbal Awan, Chairman of the GEPCO Standing Committee, said that while collective issues have been discussed, the shortage of staff is the most serious and must be resolved. He suggested that GEPCO should establish its own transformer repair workshop, as those repaired externally often fail again. GEPCO should also upgrade its transmission lines, as old jumpers and D-sets cause voltage drops and line losses, affecting both consumers and GEPCO. He also discussed issues related to demand notices and new connections. He said that although power generation and revenue collection are at peak, the quality of service is very low. He stated that 95% of transformer breakdowns are caused by faulty jumpers and disconnectors, not overload, and urged GEPCO to install new jumper loaders and D-sets to reduce breakdowns. He also recommended installing safety systems with transformers to protect GEPCO staff and avoid shutting down entire grids for a single transformer fault.



Mr. Engineer Muhammad Ayub, CEO GEPCO, acknowledged the concerns and appreciated that Gujrat's industry has never defaulted on electricity bills and always pays on time. He said that as per the instructions of Mian Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif, Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, and Sardar Awais Ahmad Leghari, Federal Minister for Energy, the department is ensuring uninterrupted power supply. He informed that new EMI meters up to 10 kW have already been installed and in the next phase EMI meters up to 5 kW will be installed, which will have automatic readings and prevent overbilling. He mentioned the launch of the Apna Meter app, which allows consumers to send their own meter readings to prevent overbilling.

He said there is no shortage of transformers, as 3-4 spare transformers are placed in each sub-division. He acknowledged the shortage of staff and said that approval for new hiring has been requested and will hopefully be granted soon. He advised registering complaints by calling 118, which are automatically forwarded to the relevant division and sub-division, and action is taken from headquarters if unresolved. He explained that shutting down the grid is necessary while replacing or repairing transformers as the entire grid is connected through one line, but efforts are being made to minimize downtime and a new system is being developed, which will take about a year to

At the end of the meeting, Mr. Fahad Rafig, Vice President of CtCCI, thanked the GEPCO team for visiting and expressed hope that the highlighted problems would be resolved. He suggested that GEPCO officials should visit GtCCI every four months and also organize an awareness session on overload management to help the industrial sector.





NIMS DELEGATION VISITS GtCC



A delegation of officers from Federal and Provincial departments, including the Police Service, Pakistan Administrative Service, Inland Revenue Service, Foreign Services and others from the 36th Senior Management Course (BS-19) of the National Institute of Management, visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry for an inland study tour under the leadership of Dr. Muhammad Farooq, Sponsor Directing Staff. The purpose of the visit was to introduce Gujrat Chamber of Commerce, its services, management, future plans, achievements, and the industries of Gujrat.

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of Gujrat Chamber, welcomed the delegation and said he is pleased to host them under the leadership of the sponsoring directing staff of the National Institute of Management. He gave them a detailed introduction to the Chamber, its services, and the industries of Gujrat. He emphasized that private sector representatives and bureaucrats are the most important stakeholders for the country's prosperity. He said that the local industry has given tough competition to the industries of China, India. and Bangladesh, but now it requires more support from government departments to accelerate industrialization and development. He highlighted challenges like the rising cost of doing business and the need to improve ease of doing business. He appreciated the establishment of business facilitation centers by the government in different districts of Punjab, but said there is still a lot of scope for improvement in Gujrat, especially in infrastructure development to promote industrialization. He hoped that political representatives, divisional and sub-district administrations, and other departments would work together for this cause. He urged the officers to involve the taxpayer community through the Chamber in the institutions they serve, to understand their problems and make better decisions. He emphasized that development can only be achieved through public-private partnerships and that businessfriendly policies can be made only through continuous engagement between government officers and the Chamber. He requested them to understand the issues on grassroot level faced by the business community, and work to solve them. He especially requested the officers to make efforts for infrastructure development and industrialization in Gujrat through their respective departments.









Dr. Muhammad Farooq said that this is a senior officers' course, and these officers have a very important input in policy formulation. The purpose of the meetings with the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry is to understand the issues of the business community and provide input for their solutions. He added that the aim of these study tours is to enable the officers to meet with institutions and decision-makers and to understand the challenges they face.













On this occasion, the officers asked various questions from the business community of Gujrat and sought their input. At the end of the meeting, Fahad Rafiq, Vice President, thanked all the guests and said that all the officers present hold senior positions and their advice is important in policy making. Therefore, we are hopeful that you will formulate policies that promote the country's industry and trade and strengthen the national economy.





MEETING WITH MD PSIC





Ms. Saira Umar, Managing Director of the Punjab Small Industries Corporation, held a meeting at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry with the local

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of Gujrat Chamber, welcomed the guest and highlighted the longstanding need for a new industrial estate in Gujrat. Over the years, several projects were initiated to establish a new industrial estate, but none of them succeeded.

He shared that in the 2021-22 Annual Development Plan, around Rs. 1.32 billion were approved from provincial funds for a new industrial estate in Gujrat, and initial progress was made. Land was allocated near Saroki, but the site was later found to be agricultural, causing the project to be abandoned. Different sites have been proposed since then, but no practical progress has been made, even though nearby Gujranwala already has three industrial estates and is planning another. He noted that the federal government has targeted an overall growth rate of 42%, and 8% for SMEs, yet achieving this is impossible without creating space and facilities for new industries. Even the existing Small Industrial Estate Gujrat faces serious problems. The Chamber has sent nominations for its Board of Management, but they have not been approved yet. He recommended that the Chamber should be fully involved in planning and establishing the new estate, and the proposed site recommended by the Chamber should be considered. He added that plot prices must be kept reasonable so industries can be set up easily, and the Board of Management of Small Industrial Estate 1 should also be approved.













Ms. Saira Umar appreciated the role of Gujrat's business community and acknowledged the lack of proper facilities in the existing Small Industrial Estate. She said that satellite images and soil tests had been reviewed for various proposed sites, but high water levels in the soil had been an obstacle. She invited the Chamber to recommend a suitable location that is not agricultural land and has proper transport access, assuring that work will be done on it. She added that efforts will also be made to resolve the existing problems, and the formation of the Board of Management will be taken up in the next board meeting with the approval of the Punjab Industries Department. She also announced that a regional office of the Punjab Small Industries Corporation will be established in Gujrat to address local issues, expressing hope that this will be approved soon.





Haji Nasir Mahmood, Group Leader, said the location recommended by the Chamber is ideal, as it is close to the city, has no water issues, and is accessible from both Jalalpur Jattan Road and Jamalpur Syedan. He stressed that land prices should be kept at government rates and that the Board of Management must also be made responsible for ensuring cleanliness and security within the estate.

Mr. Fahad Rafig. Vice President of the Chamber, expressed hope that the issues will be resolved soon and mutual

cooperation will continue

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry, attended an important meeting of various chambers of commerce held at Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry. During the session, Mr. Peshawari expressed deep concerns over the proposed legal provisions, He emphasized that Sections 37A and 37B relating to capital gains and tax treatment on the sale and purchase of shares, as well as Section 21(s) which disallows certain business expenses without digital documentation, are impractical and burdensome for genuine businesses, especially SMEs.









He urged the government to abolish Sections 37A and 37B, and amend Section 21(s) by setting its threshold at a minimum of Rs. 3 million to ensure ease of doing business. He stressed that the government must take the business community into confidence while formulating such laws, as these are directly linked to the survival and growth of industries. He expressed hope that the Government of Pakistan will seriously listen to the genuine concerns of the business community and take immediate practical steps to create a business-friendly environment in the country.







A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Zawar Dental Clinic, Gujrat to provide quality dental careservices at discounted rates for the business community. The MoU was signed by Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President GtCCI, Dr. Muhammad Zawar, Director Zawar Dental Clinic, Mr. Muhammad Usman Muzaffar, Secretary General GtCCI, and Dr. Muhammad Saleem.

Under this agreement, office bearers, executive members, former executive members, management staff of CtCCI, and their families will receive a 25% discount, while associate and corporate class members and their families will receive a 15% discount on a wide range of dental services. These services include root canal treatment, fillings, scaling and polishing, smile makeovers, tooth implantation, treatment for immature teeth, professional cleaning, braces, digital X-rays, and various other dental procedures. This collaboration reflects CtCCI's commitment to the health and well-being of its members and their families.

ISLAMIC BANKING SESSION

A seminar on Islamic Banking was organized at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry in collaboration with the Meezan Bank

Malik Zubair Ahmed, Member of the Sharia Board at Meezan Bank, delivered a detailed presentation on Islamic Banking to the attendees. He said that the system of Islamic banking is fully in accordance with Sharia, and all their banking processes comply with Islamic teachings as well as the Constitution of Pakistan. He explained the harms of interest-based banking, the methods of Islamic banking, the Sharia status of Islamic deposits, profit and loss mechanisms, and various Islamic banking products. He stated that interest-based banking will be completely eliminated from Pakistan by January 2028, and only Islamic banking will be practiced thereafter. He also answered questions from the audience.

At the end of the session, President GtCCI Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari thanked all the participants and said that in today's session, Meezan Bank has provided detailed insights on Islamic banking. He said that our religion, Islam, is a complete code of life, offering guidance on every aspect of life, including beliefs, social matters, ethics, and financial affairs, and its teachings provide guidance even in important areas like economy and finance. He emphasized that Islamic banking is an Islamic alternative to conventional banking and provides financial services while fulfilling Islamic principles. The aim of this session was to create awarenessabout Islamic banking at the public level, highlighting its need, importance, and the difference between Islamic and conventional banking.

MEETING WITH DC GUJRAT MS. NOOR-UL-AIN-QURESHI



A meeting was held at Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry under the presidency of Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of GtCCI, with Ms. Noor-ul-Ain Qureshi, Deputy Commissioner Gujrat. The meeting was attended by Mr. Haji Nasir Mehmood, Group Leader, Mr. Fahd Rafiq, Vice President; former Executive Members; and other prominent members of the business community.

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of GtCCI, welcomed the Deputy Commissioner and introduced the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry, outlining its role and services. He stated that GtCCI has consistently raised its voice for the business community and approached every possible platform to resolve their issues. As the representative body of the business sector in Gujrat, GtCCI has maintained constant engagement with the provincial and federal governments as well as other relevant institutions, effectively advocating for the interests and concerns of local traders and industrialists at every level. Referring to the recent federal budget for 2025–26, he highlighted that the business community had serious reservations regarding several proposed laws, including provisions introduced through the Finance Act and certain amendments to the Income Tax Ordinance. In this regard, GtCCI actively participated in multiple consultative sessions organized by the FPCCI and also attended meetings with the Federal Minister for Finance, Mr. Muhammad Aurangzeb, and the Prime Minister's Advisor on Finance, Mr. Haroon Akhtar, to strongly represent the concerns of the Gujrat business community. He expressed satisfaction that several proposed provisions were revised due to the collective efforts and strong representation of the business community.











The President further noted that several infrastructure development projects are currently underway in Gujrat, but their progress is extremely slow and suffers from a lack of proper planning. This has caused long-standing disruptions and losses to local businesses, particularly in the affected areas. He emphasized that such work should have been completed before the onset of the monsoon season, as the condition of roads worsens significantly after rainfall. He urged that GtCCI should be formally informed about the timelines, phases, and plans of all ongoing infrastructure and development projects in the city. He also stressed the importance of having GtCCI representation on all key district-level committees to ensure regular coordination and communication between the district administration and the business community. He, further highlighted that all traders and industrialists of Gujrat operate under the umbrella of GtCCI, and only GtCCI can collectively convey their issues to the district administration. He emphasized that the business community should be taken into confidence regarding any regulations or measures implemented at the municipal corporation level. He asserted that the representative body of the business community should be consulted beforehand, and only in cases of non-compliance after repeated warnings should punitive action be taken. He also expressed concernover the deteriorating sanitation conditions in various neighborhoods, stating that the



contract for city cleaning was awarded to Arar Group, which initially carried out its work with great enthusiasm and efficiency but has now slowed down considerably. He urged the Deputy Commissioner to ensure that proper cleaning and sanitation work resumes across the city. President concluded his remarks by expressing strong hope that under the leadership of the new Deputy Commissioner, all pressing issues will be addressed on a priority basis and that the development projects in Gujrat will be completed within their stipulated timelines. He also hoped for visible improvement in law and order, governance, education, and overall civic development in the district., Ms. Qureshi further stated that she had instructed the administration not to impose fines or seal shops without prior warnings. Professor Dr. Zahoor-ul-Haq (Tamgha-e-Imtiaz), Vice Chancellor of the University of Gujrat, visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce & Industry for a meeting with the business community of Gujrat.

Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of GtCCI, welcomed the guests and said that industry and academia play a vital role in the economic development of any region. Businesses meet the needs of people through their products and services, while academia produces skilled graduates, postgraduates, and researchers who contribute their expertise to industry and trade. He said that we are fortunate to have a public sector university providing higher education in engineering, medical sciences, arts, business, and other important fields. The Gujrat Chamber of Commerce & Industry, as a representative body of the business community, is consistently working for the growth and development of trade and industry. He emphasized that GtCCI has maintained close contact with the Office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization (ORIC) at the University of Gujrat, but these linkages had slowed in recent times. Now, both institutions have once again come on the same page to revive industry-academia collaboration.



He said that GtCCI and the University of Gujrat have jointly highlighted issues faced by local industries and are committed to finding practical solutions. In this spirit, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the two institutions. The purpose of this MoU is not just paper work but to actively work on upgrading, innovating, and solving the problems of Gujrat's industries. Through this partnership, they aim to introduce new technologies, modern machinery, and processes according to contemporary requirements, helping the local industry move toward modernization and sustainable growth. Chamber expects strong support from the University in areas of research and industry development so that the region's industries can progress in a meaningful way







Speaking on the occasion, Professor Dr. Zahoor-ul-Hag said that it was an honour to meet the business community at the Gujrat Chamber. He acknowledged their vital role in running the economy of the city and providing employment. He noted that there is a lack of strategic planning at the university, and addressing this is now a priority. He said that their new strategic plan would be based on seven key pillars, one of which is the business community. All planning will be shared with GtCCI so they can review and give feedback.

He mentioned that the university has 18,000 students, including 14,000 women, yet there has been little involvement from the business community. He invited the Chamber to play an active role and announced several key steps. Two representatives from the GtCCI Executive Body will be included in the main academic bodies of the University. Chamber representatives will also be part of the Boards of Faculties of six departments. GtCCI members will be invited as observers to the University Syndicate the highest decision-making body to provide input for improving the university





Dr. Zahoor-ul-Hag also proposed that the business community support scholarships for orphans, assuring that the university would contribute double the amount pledged by the business community. He emphasized that all decisions would be made purely on merit and visible positive change would soon be seen.

For industry-focused research, he announced plans to bring Pakistan's top twenty researchers to work on local industries, especially the pottery sector. He also highlighted that several administrative reforms have already been initiated and more improvements are underway. He stressed that the University of Gujrat can only rise among the top universities of Pakistan if the business community joins hands with them. For this purpose, a new steering committee will be formed at the university with significant representation from the industry, and its first meeting will be held soon at the Gujrat Chamber.







MEETING WITH FTO DR. ASIF MAHMOOD JAH (SI,HI)



Federal Tax Ombudsman

Dr. Asif Mahmood Jah (SI, HI) Federal Tax Ombudsman, along with, Legal Advisors, and Advisor-in-Charge, visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce & Industry and held a meeting with the business community of Gujrat.

Welcoming the guests, the President Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari said that he had recently assumed charge of the Gujrat Chamber and this was his first formal meeting with the Federal Tax Ombudsman. He appreciated that this was the second visit of the Federal Tax Ombudsman to the Chamber and that he was already well acquainted with the institution and the industrial landscape of Gujrat. He also acknowledged that the help desk of the (FTO) is actively operating within the One Window Facilitation Center of the Gujrat Chamber and thanked him for this continued support. Today's session is organized to raise awareness among taxpayers about the role of the FTO—an institution mandated to ensure prompt, fair, and independent investigation of complaints regarding tax maladministration and to redress any injustice done to taxpayers by officials of the FBR. He added that the FTO is the only platform where taxpayers can raise their voice against maladministration by the tax department and get justice.







He emphasized that if any sector of the business community believes that tax officials are misusing the system or harassing businessmen, they have a platform to report such grievances. "We should trust the Tax Ombudsman and seek their help, and I am confident that this institution will provide protection to businessmen," he said. He also highlighted that paying taxes is the responsibility of every citizen, as taxes are the backbone of the national economy. A stable economy and national development are only possible if taxes are paid timely and in full. He urged the business community of Gujratto ensure tax compliance, especially in the current circumstances where the country's economic challenges make this obligation even more critical.









Mr. Almas Jawinda advisor, said that the FTO has launched a new outreach program for the Golden Triangle region. He gave a detailed presentation about the role and functions of the Federal Tax Ombudsman. He said, "We even respond to a phone call or a simple written request on plain paper from a petitioner, and we are bound to take action." he mentioned that the FTO had successfully processed and released tax refunds worth around 18 billion rupees, which had been pending for years.

Addressing the participants, Dr. Asif Mahmood Jah said that the institution of the Federal Tax Ombudsman was established as a platform to resolve tax-related issues and to promote a taxpayer-friendly culture. "While the job of the FBR is to issue notices and pursue cases, our role isto support and facilitate taxpayers," he said. He added that the FTO has significantly expedited its processes — where previously decisions took a long time, they are now finalized within an average of 37 days. In the last ten months alone, 10,000 complaints were registered and have been acted upon, "The FTO assess, investigate, and rectify injustices faced by any person due to maladministration by tax officials.







MR. HASSAN BUTT
Director Employees Social Security Institution

A meeting was held at the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry with Mr. Hassan Butt, Director Punjab Employees Social Security Institution (PESSI) Local Office Gujrat.


Mr. Fahad Rafique, Vice President, welcomed the Director and highlighted the importance of PESSI in ensuring employee welfare. He raised concerns over recent audit notices issued to factory owners despite challenging business conditions and urged leniency, suggesting that focus be placed on registering new businesses rather than penalizing already registered ones. He also emphasized expanding the tax base to reduce the burden on existing businesses.

Mr. Hassan Butt shared that Gujrat currently ranks nineteenth in social security performance, and heaims to bring it to third, as he previously achieved in Sheikhupura. He noted that 5,324 businesses are registered with PESSI, including pottery, fan, and furniture sectors, and announced that under new laws, even businesses with two employees will be registered. He also mentioned that the 2% tax previously submitted to Federal Board of Revenue or Punjab Revenue Authority will now go to Social Security. He highlighted ongoing improvements including a 100-bed Social Security Hospital, welfare schools, dispensaries, and a new ration cardscheme offering Rs. 3,000 subsidy to workers. He assured that Gujrat's contributions are improving and pledged to resolve all issues, adding that double shifts in Social Security hospitals will soon start in Gujrat.















MEETING WITH

MR. MUHAMMAD IDREES

Deputy Director at the Labor & Human Resource Department Gujrat



Mr. Muhammad Idrees, Deputy Director at the Labor and Human Resource Department Gujrat Punjab, held a meeting with Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry, at the Chamber's office.

Mr. Idrees said that he has recently assumed charge as Deputy Director of the Labor Department in Gujrat. The purpose of his visit, he explained, was to convey an important message to the industrial and manufacturing sectors of Gujrat through the platform of the Chamber. He shared that in recent months, several labor-related accidents have occurred in Gujranwala, Sheikhupura, and Lahore. These incidents have drawn serious attention from Maryam Nawaz Sharif, Chief Minister of Punjab, and Faisal Ayub Khokhar, Minister for Labor and Human Resources.

He informed that the Chief Minister and the Minister have directed the Labor Department to carry out safety inspections at industrial and manufacturing units across all districts of Punjab. In line with these directives, the Labor Department wants to ensure that industries in Gujrat are fully aware of workplace safety requirements and prepared for inspections.

He further explained that in the first phase, departmental field officers will visit factory and industrial premises for advisory inspections. They will review safety measures and identify any shortcomings as per the POSHA Act 2019. These inspections will cover areas such as building structure and condition, emergency exit routes, machinery setup and safety measures, boiler conditions, workers' safety and health standards, and other workplace safety aspects. After this initial advisory inspection, industries will be given 15 days to address and correct the identified deficiencies. Follow-up visits will then be conducted by the department, and if the shortcomings are not resolved, legal action may be taken under the relevant laws.







President Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari thanked the Deputy Director and assured that this important message would be delivered to all members of the industrial sector through the Chamber's platform. He said the Chamber fully supports every initiative taken for the improvement and safety of the industry. He also proposed organizing an awareness seminar at the Chamber to educate the business community about these safety measures and hoped that the industrial sectors of Gujrat will fully cooperate with the Labor Department in this regard.

A meeting was held at the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry with Mr. Hassan Butt, Director Punjab Employees Social Security Institution (PESSI) Local Office Gujrat.

Mr. Fahad Rafigue, Vice President, welcomed the Director and highlighted the importance of PESSI in ensuring employee welfare. He raised concerns over recent audit notices issued to factory owners despite challenging business conditions and urged leniency, suggesting that focus be placed on registering new businesses rather than penalizing already registered ones. He also emphasized expanding the tax base to reduce the burden on existing businesses.











Mr. Hassan Buttishared that Guirat currently ranks nineteenth in social security performance, and he aims to bring it to third, as he previously achieved in Sheikhupura. He noted that 5,324 businesses are registered with PESSI, including pottery, fan, and furniture sectors, and announced that under new laws, even businesses with two employees will be registered. He also mentioned that the 2% tax previously submitted to Federal Board of Revenue or Punjab Revenue Authority will now go to Social Security. He highlighted ongoing improvements including a 100-bed Social Security Hospital, welfare schools, dispensaries, and a new ration card scheme offering Rs. 3,000 subsidy to workers. He assured that Gujrat's contributions are improving and pledged to resolve all issues, adding that double shifts in Social Security hospitals will soon start in Guirat.

Mr. Sufyan Zaheer Butt, Chairman PESSI Committee, thanked the Director and expressed hope that business community concerns would be addressed. A commemorative shield was presented to Mr. Hassan Butt by the Chamber

MEETING WITH MR. MUHAMMAD IDREES Deputy Director at the Labor and Human Resources Department Gujrat

Mr. Muhammad Idrees, Deputy Director at the Labor and Human Resource Department Gujrat Punjab, held a meeting with Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Gujrat Chamber of Commerce and Industry, at the Chamber's office.







Mr. Idrees said that he has recently assumed charge as Deputy Director of the Labor Department in Gujrat. The purpose of his visit, he explained, was to convey an important message to the industrial and manufacturing sectors of Guirat through the platform of the Chamber. He shared that in recent months, several labor-related accidents have occurred in Gujranwala, Sheikhupura, and Lahore. These incidents have drawn serious attention from Maryam Nawaz Sharif, Chief Minister of Punjab, and Faisal Ayub Khokhar, Minister for Labor and Human Resources.

He informed that the Chief Minister and the Minister have directed the Labor Department to carry out safety inspections at industrial and manufacturing units across all districts of Punjab. In line with these directives, the Labor Department wants to ensure that industries in Gujrat are fully aware of workplace safety requirements and prepared for inspections.

He further explained that in the first phase, departmental field officers will visit factory and industrial premises for advisory inspections. They will review safety measures and identify any shortcomings as per the POSHA Act 2019. These inspections will cover areas such as building structure and condition, emergency exit routes, machinery setup and safety measures, boiler conditions, workers' safety and health standards, and other workplace safety aspects. After this initial advisory inspection, industries will be given 15 days to address and correct the identified deficiencies. Follow-up visits will then be conducted by the department, and if the shortcomings are not resolved, legal action may betaken under the relevant laws.

President Mr. Muhammad Munir Peshawari thanked the Deputy Director and assured that this important message would be delivered to all members of the industrial sector through the Chamber's platform. He said the Chamber fully supports every initiative taken for the improvement and safety of the industry. He also proposed organizing an awareness seminar at the Chamber to educate the business community about these safety measures and hoped that the industrial sectors of Gujrat will fully cooperate with the Labor Department in this regard.



Chief Operating Officer of Lahore Sialkot Motorway

Khawaja Kamran Qayyum, Col. (Retd.) and Chief Operating Officer of Lahore Sialkot Motorway Infrastructure Management, visited Gujrat Chamber of Commerce & Industry and held a meeting with Muhammad Munir Peshawari, President of the Gujrat Chamber. Mr. Fahad Rafique, Vice President, and Executive Members Mr. Ahmed Hassan Mattoo, Mr. Adil Ashraf, Mr. Muhammad Imran, Mr. Zeeshan Ashraf, and Mr. Ali Shan Jamshed were present on the occasion, along with Muhammad Usman Muzaffar, Secretary General, and Shahroz Arshad, Incharge of Research and Development.







Khawaja Kamran Qayyum shared that the Lahore-Sialkot Motorway (M-11), a project of Frontier Works Organization, is being managed by Lahore Sialkot Motorway Infrastructure Management. He informed that the motorway is 90 percent complete, with only the Sambrial Link is pending. He said that the purpose of his visit was to highlight the investment opportunities available along the motorway. Around 32 acres of land are available between the service areas on the Lahore-Sialkot Motorway, where projects like shopping malls and commercial plazas can be developed. In addition, there are extensive opportunities for business advertisements. He noted that this is the first fully digital motorway in Pakistan, with international-standard service areas. He also proposed the establishment of an Expo Center in collaboration with the Colden Triangle Chambers, where local products from all three regions can be showcased.







President Muhammad Munir Peshawari welcomed him and briefed him on the key projects of the Gujrat Chamber. He said that the proposal would be discussed with the Executive Body. He expressed interest in both the Kharian and Sambrial Links, and emphasized the importance of the proposed Wazirabad Link Road on the Lahore-Sialkot Motorway, which is also called the Expressway Link. He said that although Wazirabad had been approved to connect Gujrat to the motorway, the work was stopped, and this link would be extremely beneficial for Gujrat. He further mentioned that Gujrat Chamber had earlier proposed an Expo Center near Saudra, but it could not be approved as an Expo Center needs to be located at a point where the three Chambers can easily access it.


